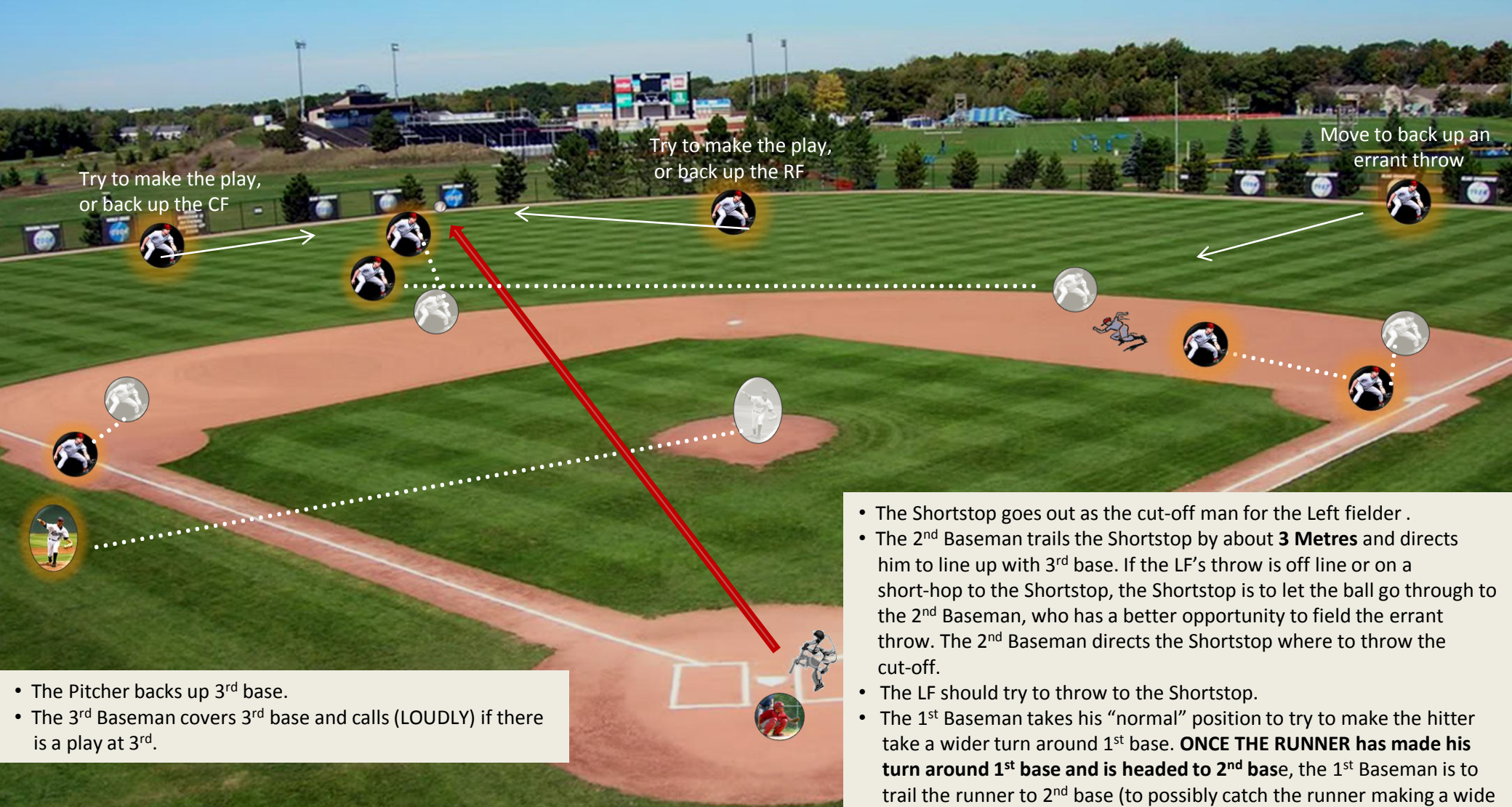


**No one on base. A ball hit to LEFT field that is at least a *double*, and possibly a *triple*.  
DOUBLE CUT to 3<sup>rd</sup> Base**



- The Pitcher backs up 3<sup>rd</sup> base.
- The 3<sup>rd</sup> Baseman covers 3<sup>rd</sup> base and calls (LOUDLY) if there is a play at 3<sup>rd</sup>.

- The Shortstop goes out as the cut-off man for the Left fielder .
- The 2<sup>nd</sup> Baseman trails the Shortstop by about **3 Metres** and directs him to line up with 3<sup>rd</sup> base. If the LF's throw is off line or on a short-hop to the Shortstop, the Shortstop is to let the ball go through to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Baseman, who has a better opportunity to field the errant throw. The 2<sup>nd</sup> Baseman directs the Shortstop where to throw the cut-off.
- The LF should try to throw to the Shortstop.
- The 1<sup>st</sup> Baseman takes his "normal" position to try to make the hitter take a wider turn around 1<sup>st</sup> base. **ONCE THE RUNNER has made his turn around 1<sup>st</sup> base and is headed to 2<sup>nd</sup> base**, the 1<sup>st</sup> Baseman is to trail the runner to 2<sup>nd</sup> base (to possibly catch the runner making a wide turn around 2<sup>nd</sup> base, but not going to 3<sup>rd</sup>). Once at 2<sup>nd</sup> base, the 1<sup>st</sup> Baseman can make the call for a throw "behind" the runner who may be making a wide turn. OR, he can make the call to throw to 3<sup>rd</sup> base.

\*\* The Shortstop will be the LEAD cut-off man for any ball hit to the left side of 2<sup>nd</sup> base. If there is any question or doubt, the SHORTSTOP WILL BE THE LEAD CUT-OFF MAN, and the 2<sup>nd</sup> Baseman will be the TRAILING man.
