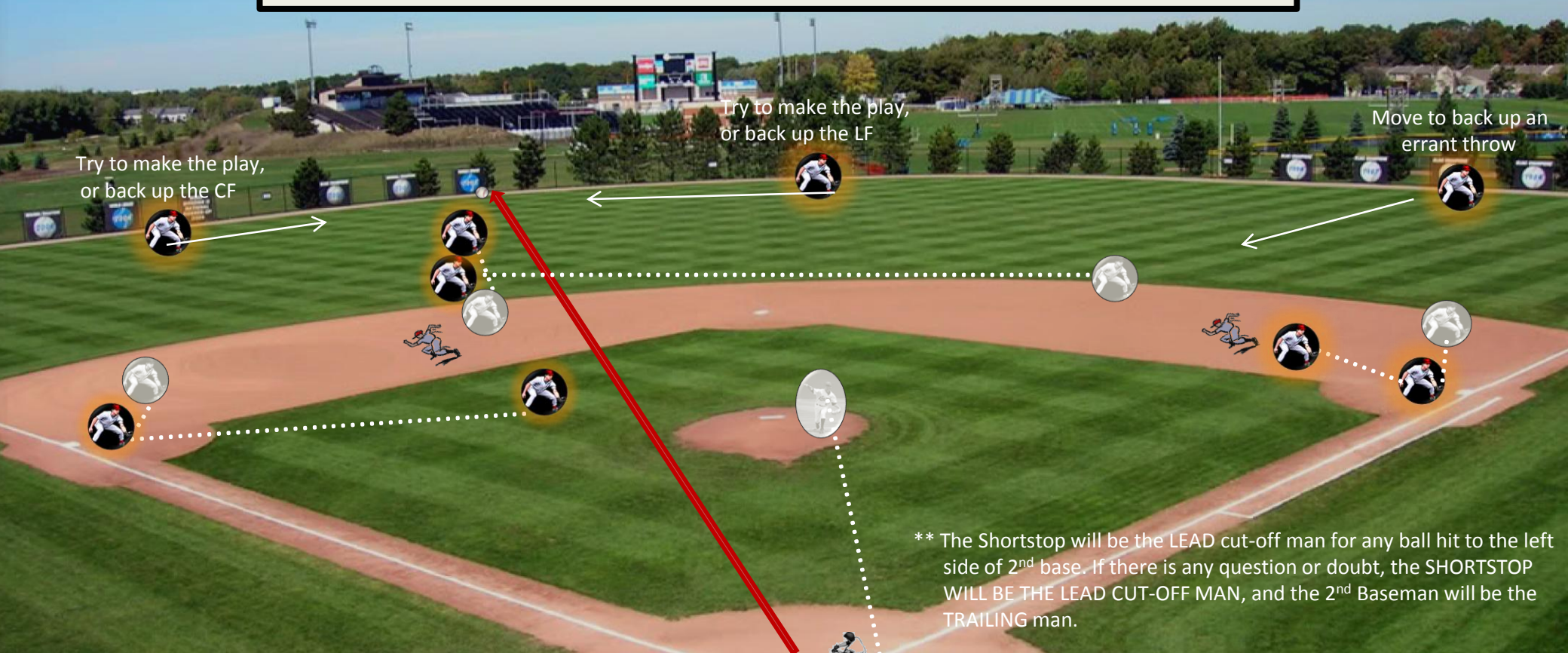


Runner on 1st base. A ball hit to LEFT field that is at least a *double*, and possibly a *triple*, with a possible play at Home.

DOUBLE CUT to Home



Try to make the play, or back up the CF

Try to make the play, or back up the LF

Move to back up an errant throw

** The Shortstop will be the LEAD cut-off man for any ball hit to the left side of 2nd base. If there is any question or doubt, the SHORTSTOP WILL BE THE LEAD CUT-OFF MAN, and the 2nd Baseman will be the TRAILING man.

- The 1st Baseman takes his “normal” position to try to make the hitter take a wider turn around 1st base. **ONCE THE RUNNER has made his turn around 1st base and is headed to 2nd base**, the 1st Baseman is to trail the batter/runner to 2nd base.
- The Pitcher backs up Home.
- The 3rd Baseman takes a position to the Pitcher’s side of 3rd base (like the 1st baseman does at 1st base, to cause the runner coming from 2nd base to make a wide turn as he heads for Home. **ONCE THE RUNNER HAS ROUNDED 3rd Base**, the 3rd Baseman takes his position as the cut-off man to Home.

- The Shortstop goes out as the cut-off man for the right fielder
- The 2nd Baseman trails the 2nd Baseman by about **3 Metres** and directs him to line up with Home. If the LF’s throw is off line or on a short-hop to the Shortstop, the Shortstop is to let the ball go through to the 2nd Baseman, who has a better opportunity to field the errant throw. The 2nd Baseman directs the Shortstop where to throw the cut-off.
- The LF should try to throw to the Shortstop, **IF HE CANNOT REACH THE 3rd BASEMAN.**
